° **Types of events: Seminar (S)/Lecture (L)/Exercise (E):** In the Exercise, the application of the methods learned in the Lecture is illustrated using numerous examples and exercises. The Exercise is part of the Lecture, an exercise date can be chosen according to the group assignment at the beginning of the semester.

\* **Exam type:** K=written exam, P=presentation/term paper/oral test etc., Port=portfolio

**DS:** during the semester=courses with performance assessments, which experience has shown can be completed during the semester. Changes are possible, so it is best to ask the respective lecturer about the form of examination at the beginning of the semester!

- 1 Course predominantly in English
- 2 Course partly in German

*Elective: Course capacities limited, prior knowledge required (preliminary examination possible)*

71442V: A mandatory introduction is required to take part in the course, the date will be announced (usually in the 1<sup>st</sup> – 2<sup>nd</sup> week of lectures).

You are free to take courses from all WBS bachelor programs, with minimal restrictions. You can mix courses from different programs, provided they meet the requirements of your home university (e.g., Learning Agreement) or your personal interests.

**Tip:** If you need a specific number of ECTS credits, consider taking an **additional joker course** to compensate for any failed exams.

**Attendance:** Most courses at WBS require compulsory attendance. If you need to pass the end-of-semester exam, we highly recommend attending all classes. Topics for group or homework are often only assigned at the beginning of the course! **Important:** Absence during the semester for partial examinations (presentation dates, partial exams, etc.) will result in failure of the entire course!

Please note the different examination regulations (POs), e.g., PO 2016/20 (old) and PO 2021/23 (new): In the **summer semester 2026**, old PO courses (first to sixth semester) will no longer be offered; only new PO courses of these semesters will be available. Some courses may overlap in timing, as the offerings cover six different programs and levels.

The **timetable** for the following semester is published four weeks before the semester starts, which might lead to minor changes in your planned courses or Learning Agreement. However, you can change and switch courses until the end of April or October\*, depending on the semester.

#### **Guide to Course ID:**

Please always use the Course ID when communicating. Only the course ID clearly describes the course with its five-digit number, the course name is often ambiguous. The first number stands for the study program, the second for the degree, the third for the semester.

For example, course ID **71172** =

**7** (Program: 7= International Management), **1** (Bachelor / Master = 2), **1** (1<sup>st</sup> semester), **72** (course).
