## **Guide to Course ID:**

Please always use the Course ID when communicating. Only the course ID clearly describes the course with its five-digit number, the course name is often ambiguous. The first number stands for the study program, the second for the degree, the third for the semester.

For example, course ID **714**12 =

7 (Program: 7= International Management),

1 (Bachelor / Master = 2),

4 (4th semester),

12 (course).
